
# **WILDFLOWERS**

a meadow in full bloom

his summer was filled with many walks and trips to different farmer's markets in Maine. We picked many bouquets of wildflowers. During a walk around downtown Boston, I spotted a square brick layout in the plaza that looked like a quilt pattern. I decided to use that brick layout for a quilt design and mixed bright colors up and around the quilt to "plant" my own Wildflowers.

## **Plan**

Spring is in the air; the perfect time for a fresh and cheerful quilt project! This fast and easy pattern is a great way to showcase a collection of gorgeous fabrics—and a precut bundle of 10" squares makes it a breeze to assemble. Refer to the cutting diagram to cut the A and C patches from 10" squares. (You will also need a 3½" B cut from the lime print square.)

With minimal cutting and simple piecing, the bold florals, playful prints, and sunny colors take center stage. It's an ideal way to whip up a vibrant quilt that celebrates the beauty of spring!

Use an accurate ¼" seam allowance throughout to ensure all elements of the quilt fit together well.

## Shop

Fabric yardage assumes 40" usable width of fabric (WOF) unless otherwise noted.

- Lime print 1 (10") square for blocks
- Black tonal ½ yd. for blocks
- 29 Assorted color prints 1 (10") square **each** for blocks
- Purple print ½ yd. for binding
- Backing 2¾ yds.
- Batting 44" × 52"

### Cut


Patches are lettered in order of use. Measurements include ¼" seam allowances.

- Lime print
  - 1 square 3½" (B) 2 rectangles 3" × 8½" (C) 2 rectangles 3" × 3½" (A)
- Black tonal 29 squares 3½" (B)
- 29 Assorted color prints from each, cut:

2 rectangles  $3" \times 8\frac{1}{2}"$  (C) 2 rectangles  $3" \times 3\frac{1}{2}"$  (A)

• **Purple print** 5 strips 2½" × WOF for binding



#### Sew


1. Sew 2 lime print A's and
1 black tonal B together as
shown in **Diagram I-A** to
make a unit 1. Repeat the
process using 2 matching A's
from the assorted color
prints with black B's to make
29 unit 1's total. Unit 1's
should measure 3½" × 8½".

In the same way, use 2 matching color A's with 1 lime B to make a unit 2 as shown (**Diagram I-B**).




Unit 2 Make 1

2. Join 2 lime C's to the matching unit 1 as shown in **Diagram II-A** to make a block Y. Repeat the process with *each* set of 2 matching color C's and a unit 1 to make 29 block Y's total.

Block Y's should measure 8½".






Block Y Make 29

In the same way, join 2 matching color C's to unit 2 as shown to make block Z (**Diagram II-B**). Block Z should measure 8½".

Diagram II-B


**NOTE:** Refer to **Assembly** Diagram for following steps, watching block Z placement.

- 3. Arrange the blocks into 6 rows of 5 blocks each as shown in the **Assembly** Diagram. Join the blocks into rows; sew the rows together to make the quilt top.
- 4. Layer, baste, and quilt. Anne machine quilted a repeating vine and leaf motif over the entire quilt surface.
- **5.** Bind the quilt.
