Princess Crown for Girls Crochet Pattern

The Princess Crown for Girls is a charming and elegant project, perfect for birthdays, dress-up parties, photo shoots, or even cozy winter days when your little one wants to feel royal.

This beautiful crown doubles as a stylish ear warmer, offering both comfort and sparkle. The delicate shell and picot stitches give it an intricate lace-like design, while the soft ribbed band ensures a snug, cozy fit. Whether you're making it for a child or an adult, this adjustable pattern guarantees a perfect fit every time.

Skill Level: Intermediate

Finished Sizes: Teen/Adult: 20" circumference × 5" height | Child: 17.5" circumference × 4.5" height

Gauge: 13 sc x 14 rows = 4" using I-9 (5.5 mm) crochet hook

Abbreviations (US Terms):

sl st - slip stitch

ch - chain

sc - single crochet

hdc - half double crochet

dc - double crochet

tr - treble crochet

sk - skip

beg - beginning

RS - right side

* ... ; - repeat from * to ; as instructed

Special Stitches:

hdc/sc in 3rd loop: Instead of working into the top two loops, insert the hook into the third loop located on the back side of your work. Complete the stitch as usual.

Picot: Ch 3, then sl st into the previous tr you just made.

Shell Stitch: (2 dc, 2 tr, picot, 2 tr, 2 dc) all in the indicated stitch.

Notes:

The pattern begins with a ribbed band, which can be easily adjusted by crocheting in multiples of 6 rows to achieve your desired size.

Join the short ends of the band to form a circle before continuing with the crown body.

The starting chain does not count as a stitch.

Teen/Adult Size (20"):

Ribbed Band: Make 66 rows for a 20" circumference. With a 5.5 mm crochet hook, ch 7.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc across. Turn. (6 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in BL of next 4 sts, sc in last st. Turn. (6 sts)

Rows 3-66: Repeat Row 2.

Join the short ends with a tapestry needle to form a band.

Body of Crown:

Round 1 (RS): Ch 1, hdc in each st around. SI st to first hdc. (66 sts)

Round 2: Ch 1, hdc in 3rd loop of each st around. SI st to first hdc. (66 sts)

Rounds 3-4: Repeat Round 2.

Round 5: Ch 1, sc in 3rd loop of each st around. SI st to first sc. (66 sts)

Round 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, *sk next 2 sts, shell st in next st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st;*

repeat from * to * around. SI st to first sc. (11 shells)

Child Size (17.5"):

Ribbed Band: Make 54 rows for a 17.5" circumference. With 5.5 mm hook, ch 6.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc across. Turn. (5 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in BL of next 3 sts, sc in last st. Turn. (5 sts)

Rows 3-54: Repeat Row 2.

Join the short ends with a tapestry needle to form the band.

Body of Crown:

Round 1 (RS): Ch 1, hdc in each st around. SI st to first hdc. (54 sts)

Round 2: Ch 1, hdc in 3rd loop of each st around. SI st to first hdc. (54 sts)

Round 3: Repeat Round 2.

Round 4: Ch 1, sc in 3rd loop of each st around. SI st to first sc. (54 sts)

Round 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, *sk next 2 sts, shell st in next st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st;*

repeat around. SI st to first sc. (9 shells)

Finishing Touches:

Fasten off and weave in all ends. Add pearls, beads, or rhinestones at the tips of each crown point for extra sparkle. Create it in pastel pinks, lavender, silver, or gold for a true royal look.
